Honors students are leaders on campus and beyond, earning top University awards and prestigious national scholarships like the Truman, Goldwater and Gilman. Many also go on to secure competitive fellowships that fund graduate study, including the National Science Foundation Graduate Research Fellowship and Phi Kappa Phi Fellowship.
