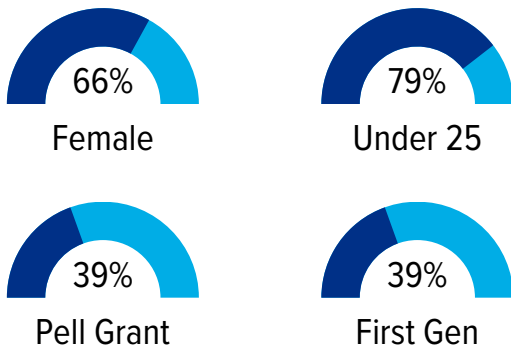
#### Student Enrollment



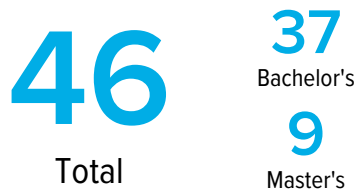
#### Number of Minors



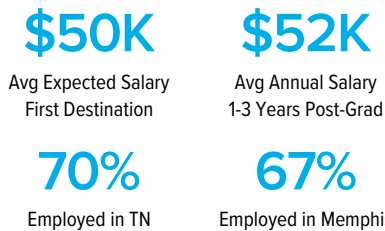
#### Student Demographics

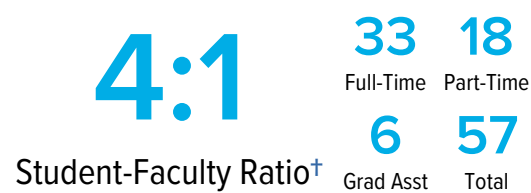
