MEETING: October 7, 2019

1. Approval of the September 9 Graduate Council minutes

Dr. Kreuz asked if there were corrections or additions to the minutes, and none were offered. Dr. Micah Trapp moved to approve, and Dr. Shelley Keith seconded the motion.

2. GA tuition cap reimbursements

Dr. Kreuz contacted chairs and graduate coordinators to assess how many students were affected by the GA tuition cap for out-of-state and international students. Twenty students in six departments were affected (this is out of a total of 510 funded students, or just 4%). The total amount for the fall term was \$18,000. Dean Abby Parrill-Baker has restored these funds to the departments, using College resources. Since the change occurred after the admissions process began, the dean wanted to put a hold the departments harmless for the change.

3. Approval of departmental curriculum changes

We talked about proposals by department. Each Council member was r3equested to summarize their new courses, title changes, and rationale for closing out courses. We did not discuss course description changes, changes in credit hours, changes in prerequisites, or changes in repeatability. Please see the GR Curriculum Summary below.

4. New business

a) Future curriculum changes. –

- a. If you are planning on making curriculum changes for next year, Dr. Kreuz has suggested the department start the process <u>now</u>. In our experience, starting this process during the spring term is too late to get changes approved in time for the College's early September deadline.
- b. There is a goal of having the Curriculog forms for next submission cycle up by mid-April of 2020. Reminder that every year your departments will be asked for a Curriculog hierarchy update. If you need guidance in this endeavor, please feel free to contact Tori Tardugno.
- c. When you are wanting to cross-list a course please be sure that the course you are wanting to cross-list with is either in existence or being proposed.
- d. Dr. Robert Cohen asked about when the new catalog will come out. Tori informed the council that Mary Kyle is hoping to have the new catalog by mid-March.

- e. ABMs If you are wanting to have up to 12 credit hours count for your ABM you must have a proposal come through both the Graduate and Undergraduate councils. It is not an automatic situation. Tori knows of at least one catalog that was proposed at 9 credit hours and the catalog says 12 credit hours. Please review your catalogs to make sure they are correct. You can have the same person complete both GR and UG proposals for ABM's. The same with 4/6 courses. f. Student Catalog Dr. Keith asked if students can choose their catalog. A student can choose a catalog during their time as a student. EX: Student was admitted for Fall 2017, they can choose Fall 2017 or any catalog after but not before Fall 2017.
- b) **Graduate Faculty status**. The elimination of the co-mentoring category is affecting between 25 and 30 faculty. Talk to Tori Tardugno after the meeting if you think you have faculty who are affected by this.
- c) **Information Fair** There were about 120 people who attended the fair this year. There were two departments that were not at the Information Fair and had students who were interested in their programs. Please make a point to be at the Graduate Information Fair.
- d) **New Business -** Dr. Kreuz asked if there was any new business to be brought before the Council. No one had new business.
 - **Special Topics** Dr. Santo asked how the proposals are moving through the steps. Tori informed the council that most of the Special Topics proposals have been approved at the College level and are currently at the GR School level. Mary Kyle will be taking care of that after they finish reviewing Curriculum proposals. Reminder that 4/6 courses and 7/8 courses can be on the same proposal only for Special Topics proposals.
- e) Dr. Kreuz thanked Tori for all her efforts in implementing the new Curriculog system, and training everyone in how to use it.
- **5. Adjournment** Dr. Kreuz asked for a motion to approve, which was made by Dr. Micah Trapp. Dr. Shelley Keith seconded the motion, and all voted in favor.
