The APA-accredited internship program at The University of Memphis Student Health and Counseling Services is a 2000-hour, 12-month training program. We use the APPIC Internship Matching Program for selection. Candidates must be enrolled in counseling or clinical psychology doctoral programs and have completed a minimum of 1000 supervised practicum hours, with 400 minimum direct clinical intervention hours. All relevant program course work must be completed. Preference will be given to candidates from APA accredited programs. It is required that candidates have completed their comprehensive exams prior to the application deadline. Dissertation proposals are required to have been approved by the start of internship.
