The Faculty Policies Standing Committee will create a working group under its responsibility, entitled the Dual-Career Task Force, to develop dual-career policy recommendations for the Senate to review by the April 20, 2021 meeting. Recommendations approved by the Senate will be submitted to Provost for consideration.
