

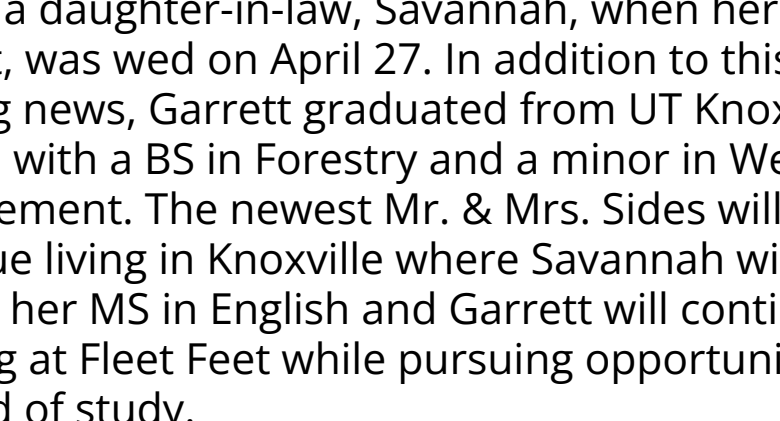
### Maddie Stoks engaged to be married

### Dr. Mehdi Amini received approval for prestigious research grant from NSF

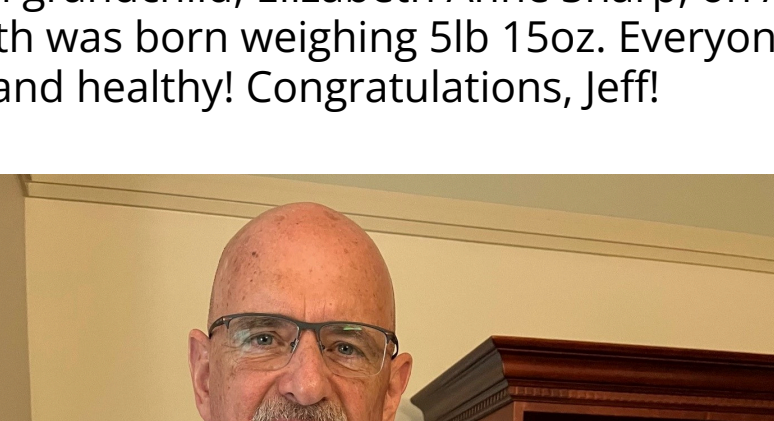
