distracted driving can be dangerous for us, our passengers and other drivers on the road. Let's take a moment to understand what constitutes distracted driving and explore ways to ensure our safety on the road. Distracted driving defined as any activity that takes your attention away from driving. This includes texting or talking on the phone, eating, adjusting the radio

and even daydreaming. It is important to remember that even a momentary lapse in attention can have devastating consequences. If you are the driver, follow these steps for a safe drive: • If you are expecting a text message or need to send one, pull over and park your car in a safe

Ask your passenger to be your "designated texter." Allow them access to your phone to respond to

- calls or messages. Do not engage in social media scrolling or messaging while driving. • Cell phone use is habit-forming. Are you struggling
- to text and drive? Activate your phone's "Do Not Disturb" feature, silence notifications or put your phone in your vehicle's trunk, glove box or back seat until you arrive at your destination.
- Drive safely.
