The primary objective of the Intemational Business Program is to provide a broad, interdisciplinary educ ation for a career in intemational business. Through the study of theoretic al and practical aspects of the operations of intemational and multinational business and through work in several liberal arts disciplines, the graduate of this program should be prepared, after receiving a basic orientation training in a particularintemational firm, to apply the knowledge acquired to the solution of problems faced by the company.

## CAREER OPPORIUNIIES

Intemational Business is an interdisc iplinary major that provides the student with basic problem-solving a nd a nalytic al tools, while providing opportunities to explore several intemational areas of interest. It is a rigorous and highly respected field of study that prepares students for many ca reer options. Intemational Business graduates may go on to careers as economists, managers, administrators, legislators, analysts, la wyers, consultants, fina ncial planners, and entrepreneurs. Opportunities for Intemational Business majors should be best in businesses having intemational connections and govemment at all levels. Employment is expected to grow faster than the average for all occupations.

## INTERNSHIPS

Intemships are available with a variety of businesses, in such diverse activities as manufacturing orfinancial services, or with local or state govemments and agencies.

## Course Requirements Major (27 hours)

A minimum 2.25 GPA is required in the major.

A maximum of 3 credit hours of BA 4911 can be used for this category.

Choose 1 (3 hours): Intemational Intemship (BA 4911), Intemational Independent Study (BA 4910), or Study Abroad

Foreign Language (6-12 hours): Complete 6 semester hours in one modem foreign language at or above the 2000 level or equivalent

Minor ( 12 hours): Forstudents whose major is in The Fogelman College of Business and Economics: Choose 4 courses with the approval of the Intemational Business a dvisor from: ECON 4350, 4351; FIR 3720, 4440, 4550, 4720; MGMT4510, 4810; MIS 4310, 4321; MKTG 3410, 4080, 4470, 4530; SCMS 2610, 4510, 4511.

Minor (18 hours): For students whose major is in another college of the university:
Choose 6 courses with the approval of the Intemational Business advisor from: 18 hours, at least 9 of these hours must be from ECON 4350, 4351; FIR 3720, 4440, 4550, 4720; MGMT4510, 4810; MIS 4310, 4321; MKTG 3410, 4080, 4470, 4530; SCMS 2610, 4510, 4511.
