RANDOMIZED CONTROL TRIAL IS OVER!

On Wednesday, June 5, the GROWWTH program officially ended randomization. We met the required enrollment goal of 700 as part of the TANF Opportunity Act Study.

We are the FIRST pilot program in Tennessee to achieve our enrollment goal!

Now, those who enroll are no longer randomly sorted in two groups. All newly enrolled participants will be eligible for full GROWWTH services.

This milestone is one we've eagerly awaited since GROWWTH's official launch in February of 2023. We celebrate this achievement by expanding our staff by hiring more Case Managers, intake staff, Business Services Specialists to welcome new participants.

We've Expanded Our Offices!

With our staff growing, it also means we need more space. The former Textbook Brokers of Memphis on Walker Avenue, just two blocks from the U of M main campus, has been transformed into new offices and meeting space for our program. In this new space, our team will be able to meet participants for intake and enrollment, administering supportive services and host events.
