

MM-DMA Accelerated Track Performance (2019) Degree timeline

*These suggested timelines should be used as guides when creating a student's degree plan.
Students must submit the degree plan by the end of the second semester of study.*

First Semester Register for 9 credits.

1. Take entrance examinations in music history and theory and register for any required remedial courses.
2. Review any foreign language requirements for the degree concentration ([see 3.6 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
3. Review the degree plan with your major professor and begin to map out the timeline for completing the degree ([see 6.12 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).

Second Semester Register for 9 credits.

4. Complete any foreign language requirements.
5. Submit degree plan to the School of Music Graduate Studies Office ([see 6.12 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
6. Fulfill the residency requirement by completing at least two successive semesters as a full-time student.
7. Perform first graduate recital (MM recital).

Third Semester Register for 9 credits.

8. Establish doctoral committee in consultation with major professor.
9. Begin discussing possible DMA cognate options with major professor.

Fourth Semester Register for 8 credits.

10. At the beginning of the semester, apply to graduate for the MM degree ([see 6.11 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
11. Complete a [Change of Status form](#) in order to advance from the master's program to a doctoral program.
12. Begin discussing document/dissertation topics with major professor and doctoral committee.
13. Take the MM Comprehensive Examination
14. Perform second graduate recital (first DMA recital).

Fifth Semester Register for 9 credits.

15. Update student degree plan with choice of doctoral cognate and submit to the School of Music Graduate Studies Office ([see 6.12 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
16. Submit and present document/dissertation proposal to doctoral committee.

Sixth Semester Register for 10 credits.

17. Take the Qualifying Exams Take the Qualifying Exams the week before the semester begins. ([see 6.6 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
18. Perform third graduate recital (second DMA recital).

Seventh Semester Register for 9 credits.

19. Take written and oral Comprehensive Exams ([see 6.7 in the Graduate Handbook](#)). Once the Comprehensive Exams are passed doctoral candidacy is granted.

Eighth Semester Register for 9 credits.

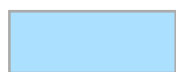
20. At the beginning of the semester, apply to graduate ([see 6.11 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
21. Submit approved dissertation to your doctoral committee at least one month in advance of the defense ([see 6.10 in the Graduate Handbook](#)).
22. Perform final recital/lecture recital and defend the document/dissertation.
23. Submit a copy of the final version of the document/dissertation to the Graduate School.
