BIOGRAPHIES

Dr. Emily Frizzell, conductor and mezzo-soprano, is an Assistant Professor of Music Education at the University of Memphis and Director of the Memphis Youth Chorale. At UofM, Dr. Frizzell teaches undergraduate and graduate music education courses, supervises music residents, and directs Tigerchor Tenor/Bass Choir. Additionally, she serves as the faculty sponsor for UofM [blu] a cappella and the UofM student chapter of the American Choral Directors Association. Dr. Frizzell is an active presenter, adjudicator, clinician and researcher, with writings published in PLOS One and GIA Publications.

Before her time at UofM, Dr. Frizzell worked as Director of Choirs at White Station Middle School for seven years. Before White Station, she was the Assistant Director of Choirs at Southaven High School and Southaven Middle School, She served as WTVMEA Junior High Choral Festival Co-Chair from 2013-2016. She also served as the Memphis City Schools Teacher Field Test Group and Development Team member, which developed the pilot portfolio evaluation method for Tennessee music teachers in 2012. Dr. Frizzell was also a Peer Evaluator of this portfolio evaluation method and a curriculum writer for Shelby County Schools. In 2013, she was awarded the Outstanding Young Music Educator award by the Tennessee Music Education Association. Her choir, the WSMS Chorale, was selected to perform at the 2013 NAfME conference in Nashville. TN and the 2014 TMEA conference in Memphis, TN. Additionally, she served on the Tennessee Department of Education Music Standards Writing Team in 2016.

Dr. Frizzell is an active member of the West Tennessee Vocal Music Educators Association, the National Association for Music Education, the American Choral Directors Association, the Society for Music Teacher Education, and the A Cappella Education Association. She earned a Ph.D. in Music Education from the University of Memphis and a Master's in Music Education and a Bachelor's in Music Education from the University of Southern Mississippi. She lives in Lakeland, Tennessee, with her husband, JD, their children, Henry and Elliott, and their dog, Ari.

BIOGRAPHIES

From Arkansas and Texas, **Mrs. Kinsey Healy** settled in Tennessee after earning her Bachelor of Choral Music Education and Master of Music from the University of Memphis. She has been the Director of Choirs at Houston High School since 2018 and previously taught at Colonial Creative and Performing Arts Middle School in Memphis Shelby County Schools. Mrs. Healy has served as a Mentor Teacher for emerging choral music educators at the University of Memphis and has led seminars about vocal health and technique in her community and at the 2022 TnMEA All State Conference. Her choirs at Houston High School perform throughout their community and tour annually with their most recent destinations being Prague, Vienna, Ireland, and Spain. Aside from her public school teaching career, she is an accompanist, church music director, and private instructor for voice and piano.

Graduate Staff

Kane Bradley is originally from Russellville, AR and served for six years as Director of Choral Activities at Pottsville High School, Junior High School, and Middle School. He holds a Bachelor's degree in Secondary Vocal Music Education from Arkansas Tech University as well as a Master's degree in Choral Conducting from Arkansas State University. Between his Bachelor's and Master's degrees, he taught for two years in Northeast Arkansas for the Buffalo Island Central School District, focusing on senior high and junior high choral music, as well as 7th and 8th grade general music. He has held professional memberships in ArkCDA (Arkansas Choral Directors Association), AR-ACDA (Arkansas Chapter of American Choral Directors Association), and ASCAP (American Society of Composers, Authors, and Publishers). He is currently in his third year as a graduate student at the University of Memphis under the direction of Dr. Francis Cathlina, where he will graduate in 2025 with a Doctor of Musical Arts in Choral Conducting.

Collaborative Pianist

Amy Nguyen currently serves as the collaborative artist for the University of Memphis Choral Arts Department. She regularly performs with students, faculty, and guest artists at the University of Memphis. She works throughout the Mid-South, performing at area high schools, colleges, and churches. Nguyen has performed throughout the country, including performances with the Independence Symphony, the Kansas City Symphony, and the Memphis Symphony Orchestra. She has played for the West TN Youth Chorus and the Collegiate School of Memphis.

Nguyen started her piano studies at the age of five. She earned a Bachelor of Arts Degree with Honors from Graceland University where she studied with Charles Schmidt. Under the tutelage of Richard Smith, she earned a Master of Music Degree from Central Missouri State University. She also studied with Betty Mallard at the University of Texas at Austin.
