WHY UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS (UofM)?

The UofM's MHA Program is Tennessee's first Commission on Accreditation of Healthcare Management Education (CAHME) accredited program. The program is nationally-ranked with an award-winning emphasis on leadership and professional development.

WHAT IS THE MASTER OF HEALTH ADMINISTRATION?

The Master of Health Administration program prepares students for leadership and management roles in the healthcare industry. It can be completed full-time in two academic years or part-time in as few as three years. Evening classes accommodate both full-time/part-time students.

PROGRAM OUTCOMES

Achieve competencies in management and leadership, communication and interpersonal effectiveness, critical thinking, analysis and problem solving, professionalism, ethics, and transparency and science/analysis — five skill areas necessary for success as a healthcare leader.

Develop professional skills such as interviewing, resume design, networking, dining etiquette, dressing for success and presentation skills to impress employers and form professional connections.

EMPLOYMENT PREPAREDNESS

Many students receive nationally competitive post-graduate fellowships. Students also find post-graduate career opportunities through their administrative residency experiences.

For the past three years, UofM's MHA program has a 98% 90-day job placement rate.
