

ABOUT THE PROGRAM

The University of Memphis School of Public Health and the Fogelman College of Business & Economics offers a 71-credit dual degree program that provides an educational experience in both healthcare management and general business knowledge and skills.

This program can be completed in a full-time schedule of 24 months or a part-time schedule for more flexibility. Executive MHA students complete the MHA and MBA courses entirely online. Residential MHA students complete the MHA courses on campus.

BENEFITS OF THE MHA/MBA

- Earning a dual degree in Health Care Administration and Business Administration makes graduates more competitive for health care administration jobs and post-graduate fellowships.
- Students complete MHA program courses and nine MBA courses to earn both degrees.
- Executive MHA students can waive up to 15 combined credit hours through course transfer, credit by examination and experiential learning credit.

- Applicants must apply separately to the MHA and MBA programs and be accepted to both independently.
- Bachelor's degree with minimum GPA of 3.0.
- Curriculum Vitae or Resume
- Statement of Purpose (MHA) / Personal Statement (MBA)
- Response to Essay Question (MBA)
- Three letters of recommendation
- Executive MHA applicants must have at least five years of clinical or managerial experience. This is not required for Campus MHA applicants.
- International applicants will need to satisfy additional requirements.
