



Enhance Your Research with NSF-NIST Supplemental Funding

The National Science Foundation (NSF) and the National Institute for Standards and Technology (NIST) have issued a Dear Colleague Letter for NSF-NIST Interaction in Basic and Applied Scientific Research to call attention to supplemental funding opportunities for researchers supported by NSF to collaborate with researchers in the NIST Laboratories and User Facilities.

PIs with current active NSF awards are eligible to submit NSF supplemental funding requests for travel expenses and per diem associated with work onsite at NIST to collaborate on research with NIST staff and access specialized research instrumentation. The participating NIST Laboratories and User Facilities are:

- Communications Technology Laboratory (CTL)
- Engineering Laboratory (EL)
- Information Technology Laboratory (ITL)
- Materials Measurement Laboratory (MML)
- Physical Measurement Laboratory (PML)
- Center for Neuron Research (NCNR)
- Center for Nanoscale Science and Technology (CNST)
